Sat, Feb. 13, 2021 8.9" at SEA, snowiest day since Dec. 1968!

Major ice storm, southwest Virginia

Sun, Feb. 14, 2021

Major ice storm, NW Oregon 6" of snow in OKC, MaxT 12F All-time record cold, snow, and ice across Texas. Houston 145 pile up, millions



National Weather Service unrestricted mesoscale analysis (URMA) hourly temperatures (F) averaged daily from Midnight to 11 pm CST.






### Heavy rainfall/Flash Flood event of March 27-28, 2021

- Overall totals (left image) reached 5-9" across Middle Tennessee.
- Second wettest two day period on record for Nashville, 7.01" (#1 remains 13.57" from May 1-2, 2010)
- Flood/flash flood reports covered much of Tennessee, southeast Kentucky, and westernmost Virginia
- Significant flash flooding led to at least 6 deaths







#### Northwestern U.S. Preliminary New All-time Maximum Temperature Records




Since Sunday, the following locations in Washington and Oregon established new preliminary all-time maximum temperature records for any calendar day. It is quite remarkable for these temperature records to occur in June, even more remarkable some locations obliterated their previous all-time records by more than 10 degrees, and quite incredible that, in the majority of cases, the prior all-time record maximum temperature had only been set 24 hours earlier!












Estimated 2-day rainfall July 7-8 from Elsa






#### WPC Excessive Rainfall Outlooks for Period from 12Z 1 Sep 2021 to 12Z 2 Sep 2021



Approximately 58 hours lead time on initial ramp up in flash flooding in Philly metro area (61hr in NYC) with the first Moderate Risk, and 24 hours in Philly for the High Risk upgrade (27hr in NYC). 65 initial Flash Flood Warnings ("NEW" tag) in the Northeast, with 9 Flash Flood Emergencies, including NYC. High Risk entirely covered by warnings during the valid period, and all warnings were within the Moderate or High Risk areas.


#### December Outbreak







A record-setting December tornado outbreak with over 60 tornadoes and at least 80 deaths. Nighttime tornadoes over this region of the country are notoriously deadly and this was an incredibly damaging and deadly event. Total losses will be in the billions of dollars. Town of Mayfield, KY took a direct hit from EF4 tornado.




