



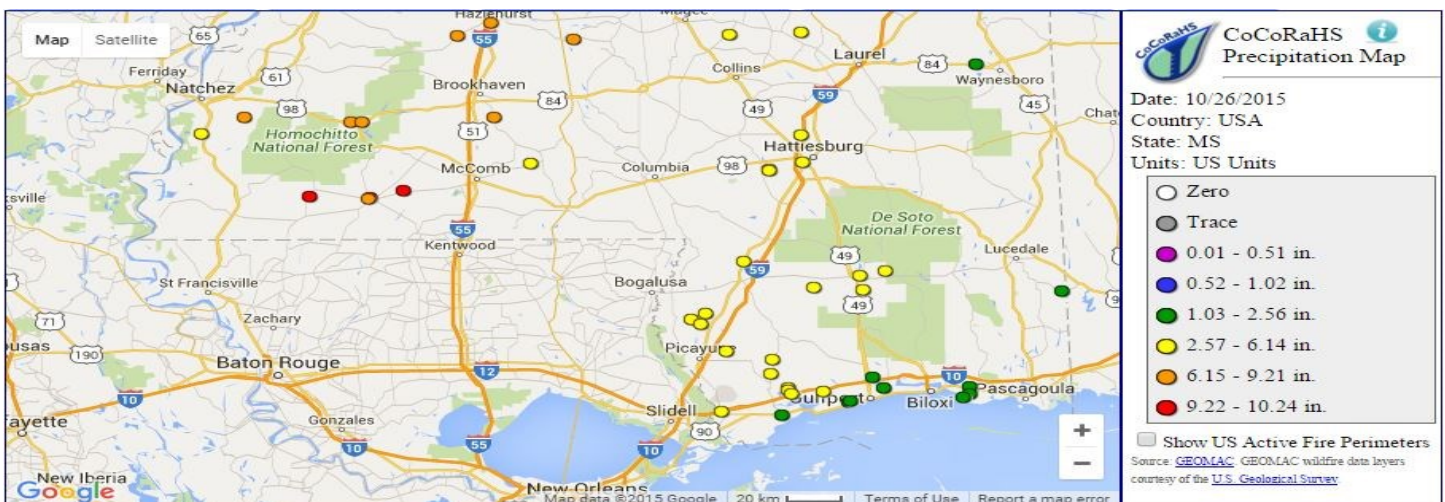
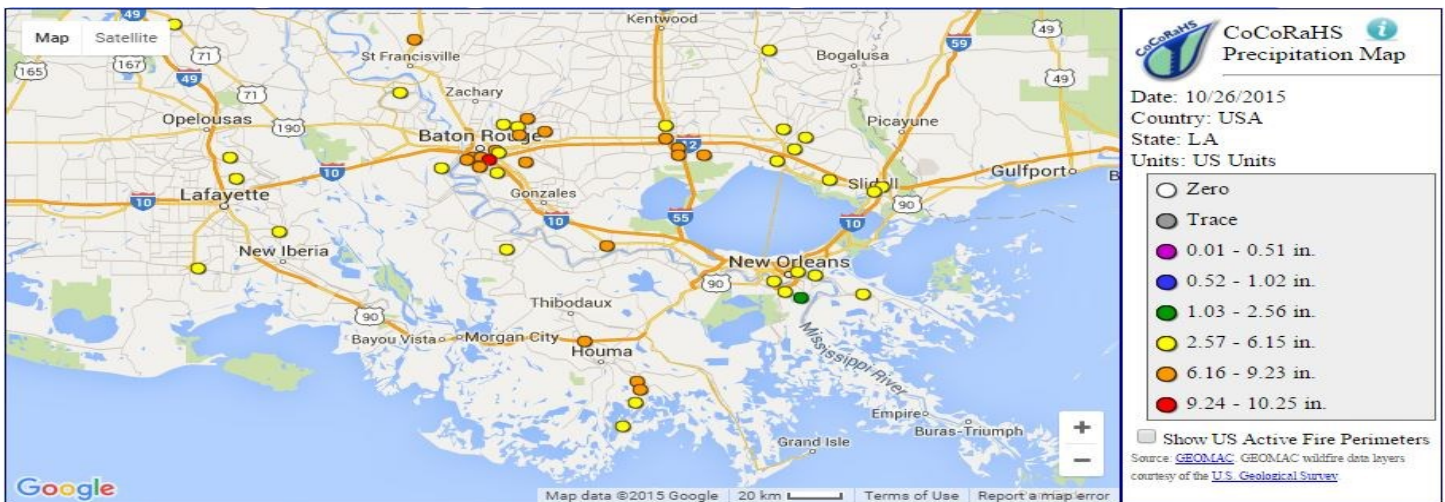

On the weather side this month, it was a pretty quiet and rain free month overall until the end of the month when we saw a combination of events including moisture from the once strongest hurricane on record (Patricia) lead to significant rain totals across the area. - ◆ Stations Reporting: 105; Number of Reports: 2327; Average per day: 75.1
- ◆ Busiest Reporting Day: 27th, average: 0.31”, max amount: 1.31”, number of reports: 90
