## A Wet July Puts a Damper on Drought

A very wet stretch of days that on-set around the middle of the month and continuing through the end of July has pretty much erased the drought that has been underway this spring and early summer along the Gulf Coast. The rainfall totals have been quite impressive, with some locations getting in excess of 5 inches a day on several days. The wettest days appear to have been the 17th-18th and again on the 25th

-26th. Thirty-five locations, mainly in the southern part of the Magnolia State, measured in excess of 10 inches of the month. While this excessive rainfall has provided much needed relief, the longer drought indicators continue to favor an abnormally dry situation. Conditions are still favorable for a return to a prolonged drought if the rain frequency diminishes over the next few months. See the tables below for extreme details.
