

Precipitation Variability

Did you know that you can look at a time range of precipitation data? All you have to do is go to the map feature on the CoCoRaHS website and change day to range at the top. You can really see the range in precipitation across the state. Around 8-9 inches fell in parts of Butler County, Ohio. Other parts of the state, the far northwest and far southeast, only had between 2-3 inches. Some counties have around 2 inch differences just in one county. This really goes to show the importance of each CoCo-RaHS observation in helping fill in the precipitation picture.

Skywarn Storm Spotter Training

Are you interested in severe weather? SKYWARN® is a volunteer program with between 350,000 and 400,000 trained severe weather spotters. These volunteers help keep their local communities safe by providing timely and accurate reports of severe weather to the National Weather Service. Skywarn spotter classes are held this time of year and there are still some left if you would like to attend one. 

Here are the long awaited results...

CoCoRaHS began in **Colorado** in **1998**. The Fort Collins **flood** was the type of weather event that occurred a year prior in Colorado that was a driving reason behind CoCoRaHS. CoCoRaHS gradually expanded with time. Ohio was the **39th** state to join and joined in **2009**. The last state to join was **Nebraska** in 2013. The number of CoCoRaHS daily precipitation observations that you have to submit to become part of the CoCo-RaHS data archived by the National Centers of Environmental Information (NCEI) is **100**. 'The Catch' is **Nolan Doesken's** monthly CoCoRaHS e-mail message. When did you join CoCoRaHS and why? I personally joined CoCoRaHS because I love the weather and continue because I love being a part of the **CoCoRaHS community**. I see the data being utilized first hand each day. I also use the data to know when to water my garden. Ashley has been a state coordinator with CoCoRaHS in Ohio since 2009. Prior to that time Ashley was a state coordinator for Indiana.
